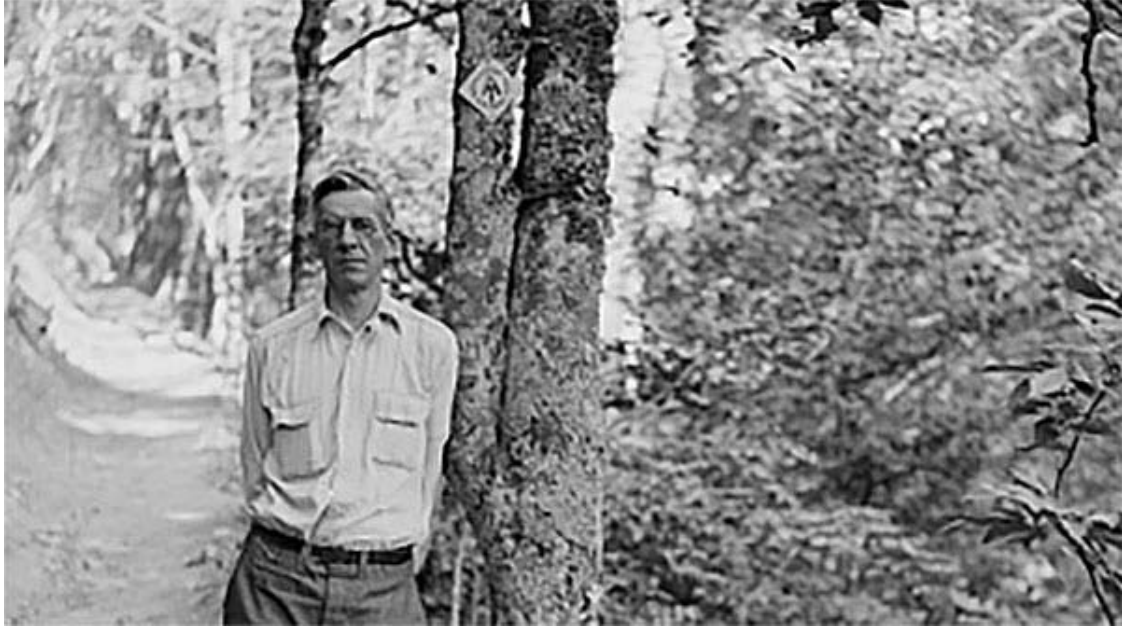


A Network of Trails

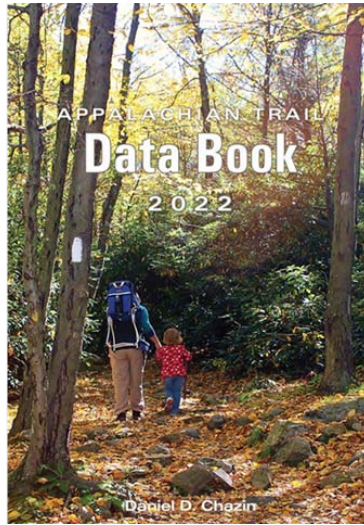


Bill Saunders
